As you may have heard a new rural network focusing on Rural Health has been established. The Rural Health and Care Alliance is a joint initiative between the Rural Services Network and the new National Centre for Rural Health and Care and will be launched in Parliament on Tuesday 16th October. It is the first time a national initiative of this nature has been taken in relation to rural health across England.

There will be a membership fee. We are however seeking to minimise that for RSN members due to their current involvement with RSN.

In a 2017 national survey involving people in rural areas the availability of Health Services in rural areas topped the list of those issues that the 2,500 people commenting were most concerned about.

It is important that the network is set up to both explore and represent the rural case in relation to rural health and rural health services and we will continue to work to this end. It is also vital that individual local authorities across England are involved as part of their day to day operation.
